

ABOUT NIMS UNIVERSITY & NSS CELL



Nims University is the premier institution for higher education in the state of Rajasthan and it has completed fourteen years of its existence. Prof. (Dr.) Balraj Singh Tomar laid the foundation stone of the University in 2008 at the foothills of Aravali on the Jaipur-Delhi Highway, established under The Nims University Act, 2008, enacted by the Government of Rajasthan and recognized by the Government of India Under the provisions of Sections 2(f) of the University Grants Commissions Act, 1956.

Ever since its inception, the university has been trying to achieve excellence and fulfil the objectives as envisaged in the University Act. The National Service Scheme unit of Nims University, Rajasthan, Jaipur has been functioning well with so many activities furnishing development to the volunteers as well as the community. The symbol thus stands for continuity as well as change and implies the continuous striving of NSS for social change.

- 2021: Ecosystem Restoration, hosted by Pakistan ¹**
- 2020: Time for Nature, hosted by Colombia, which focused on biodiversity.**





Individual action we awared are:


- ~Reduce plastic usage & prefer cloth bags
